TITLE: Proposed Resolution No. 01-2015 Amending System Development Charges and Declaring Effective Date

ITEM: The District's System Development Charge (SDC) Ordinance requires annual indexing of the charges between formal methodology updates to avoid large increases. This resolution will increase the District's SDCs by 2.4% based on the change in the Seattle Construction Index as published in the Engineering News Record. The December 201 Index is 10,384.58. The December 2013 Index was 10,142.65. This change would increase the SDC on a 5/8x3/4-inch meter from \$3,054.00 to \$3,127.00, an increase of \$73.00.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 1-2015.

BUDGET IMPACT: This change could increase SDC revenues for the last five months of the FY 2014-2015 budget by an estimated \$500.00 or less.

RESOLUTION NO. 1-2015

A RESOLUTION AMENDING SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT CHARGES FOR THE WEST SLOPE WATER DISTRICT; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF FEBRUARY 1, 2015

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2001 the Board of Commissioners of the West Slope Water District ("District") adopted Ordinance No. 1-01 establishing system development charges (SDCs), and other related procedures to comply with ORS 223.297 to ORS 223.314, inclusive, to provide revenues necessary for capital improvements constructed and to be constructed within the District; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the methodology provided in Section 5C of Ordinance No. 1-01, the Administrative Staff of the District has calculated the amount of SDCs to be imposed by the Board of Commissioners to collect the statutorily authorized, necessary revenues; and

WHEREAS, the District adopted Resolution No. 12-01 that established SDC amounts, in accordance with Section 5 of Ordinance No. 1-01, effective December 12, 2001; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5 of Ordinance No. 1-01, Staff of the District reviewed construction costs as published by Engineering News Record (ENR), Construction Cost Index for the Seattle area for the calendar year 2014; and the Board of Commissioners being fully advised amends the SDCs for the District as set forth; and

WHEREAS, the District adopted Resolution No. 2-2014 amending the schedule of charges relating to water system development charges, and

WHEREAS, construction costs have increased 2.4% between December 2013 and December 2014 as evidenced by the ENR CCI (Seattle), and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners by this resolution amends the SDC for the District as set forth below.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE WEST SLOPE WATER DISTRICT THAT:

Section 1: Resolution No. 2-2014 is hereby repealed and superceded by this Resolution No. 1-2015, effective at 8:00 a.m., PDT on February 1, 2015.

Section 2: The Board adopts the adjustment of SDC's based on the change in the Engineering News Record Cost Construction Index for the Seattle area for the calendar 2014.

Section 3: Pursuant to Section 2, above, the SDC is calculated by the change in the index from a value of 10,142.65 (December 31, 2013) to a value of 10,384.58 (December 31, 2014), which is a 2.4% increase.

Section 4: The system development charges are hereby adopted as the rate for SDCs in the District, in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

The BCI's annual escalation rate increased to 2.9% from 2.8% last month, primarily due to a 0.5% rise in the index's labor component.



Construction activity in Seattle is following two different paths, as the housing boom continues, while the non-residential market falters, according to a forecast by Dodge Data & Analytics. The housing narket in the Seattle metropolitan area is expected to ncrease 17.1% this year to \$4.7 billion, marking the ourth consecutive year of double-digit growth. The ion-residential building market is predicted to slip 3.2% this year, following 2013's 52% rebound.
